



Builder falls through opening in floor, shatters arm

\$1 million settlement

The plaintiff, a subcontractor working on the remodeling of a residential home, tripped and fell through an unguarded opening to the floor below.

He suffered serious fractures to his major arm, which required multiple surgeries, including a procedure involving the shortening of his ulna to reduce the considerable pain.

The defendant argued that the plaintiff's negligence caused him to fall and that the floor was covered when last viewed by the construction supervisor.

The plaintiff contended that the purpose of code requirements mandating the covering of floor openings is to prevent precisely the kind of injury he suffered.

The case settled for the policy limits and a small additional sum from the uninsured owner of the property.
